

# HIGHER EDUCATION

The Town of Firestone's workforce is supported by regional technical schools, community colleges, and 4-year colleges and universities. The diversity of specialized programs offered through these schools contributes to a strong workforce to support the successful operation of businesses in the Town of Firestone.

## 2-YEAR COMMUNITY COLLEGES AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS



**Aims Community College** offers more than 200 degree and certificate programs at one of the most affordable tuition rates in the Front Range, with four campuses, day and evening classes, extensive online course offerings, and top-rated faculty. Aims partners with the St. Vrain Valley School District and other local school districts to offer college programs in high school, as well as workforce development and continuing education programs. The main campus is located 22 miles northeast of Firestone in Greeley. The Fort Lupton campus, located 11 miles east of Firestone, features Welding Technology and Agricultural Sciences and Technology. The Windsor campus, located approximately 25 miles north of Firestone, features the Automotive and Technology Center and Public Safety Institute. School enrollment is a little over 6,000. **Front Range Community College (FRCC)** offers career/technical programs to train students for immediate employment and careers in more than three dozen high-demand fields. More than 20 of the certificate or Associate of Applied Science programs offered have state, regional, and/or national accreditation. The primary campus is located 16 miles south of Firestone in Westminster. The Boulder County campus, located 15 miles west of Firestone in Longmont, is home to the Center for Integrated Manufacturing, and FRCC's advanced manufacturing degrees. This campus also partners with the St. Vrain Valley School District to offer college programs in high school. Other programs unique to this campus include Fermentation Sciences, Geospatial Science, and Teaching English as a Second Language. School enrollment is just under 19,000.
